BACKGROUND

The case was tabled at the monthly ECPHRA APM committee meeting held on 30 July 2024, where a NID and a Heritage Impact Assessment was requested.

The proposed development of Erf 325 Theescombe spans an area of 17.438 hectares. The development intends to accommodate 412 units, with additional provisions for a gatehouse and a community centre. The total built-up area will be 34,656 square meters. Parking provisions include 633 bays. 74,800 square meters of open space is provided. Infrastructural development includes the installation of utilities such as water supply, sewage, electrical, and communication lines, ensuring proper drainage systems are in place, and constructing internal roads, pathways, and parking areas.

ECPHRA (Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Authority) COMMENTS in terms of Section 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act (25 of 1999).

This case was tabled at the Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM)

Committee meeting held on 6 August 2025.

ECPHRA Comment:

ECPHRA acknowledges and accepts the comprehensive Archaeological Impact Assessment (Reichert, K. July 2024) and the Paleontological Impact Assessment (Nel, R. May 2024).

There are no objections to the proposed development, provided that the specialists' and ECPHRA's recommendations are adhered to.

A. ECPHRA Recommendations:

General pre/construction phase requirements:

- The project proponent/representative must notify ECPHRA of the date of commencement of the project and share the Environmental Authorisation (EA).
- A Chance Finds Protocol (CFP) must be submitted to ECPHRA for approval, before the start of the pre/construction phase.

- Heritage induction and training must be undertaken for all ground crew, including the ECO. Proof thereof to be shared with ECPHRA.
- There should be monitoring, after vegetation clearing by an archaeologist and reports to be submitted to ECPHRA.
- An archaeologist must be on site during excavations, owing to the important heritage and sites that have been identified close to this area (Binneman 2008, Mncwabe-Mama 2023). This may necessitate further phase 2 research. Reports after excavations must be submitted to ECPHRA.
- The PIA CFP on page 31, must be adhered to.

Post Construction phase requirements:

Upon completion of the project, a final heritage compliance report to be submitted to ECPHRA.

R 500 NID fee (unpaid).

R 1 500 HIA assessment fee (unpaid).

B. AIA recommendations page 13 (Reichert, K. 2024).

The main impact on possible archaeological sites/remains will be the physical disturbance of the material and its context. Should such material be exposed then work must cease in the immediate area and it must be reported to the archaeologist at the Albany Museum in Makhanda (Grahamstown) (Tel: 046 622 2312) or to the Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority (Tel.: 043 492 1370), so that a systematic and professional investigation can be undertaken. Sufficient time should be allowed to remove/collect such material (See Appendix B for a list of possible archaeological sites that maybe found in the area). The developer must finance the costs should additional investigations be required. It is further recommended that:

- 1. Construction managers/foreman should be informed before clearing/construction starts on the possible types of heritage sites and cultural material they may encounter and the procedures to follow when they find sites.
- 2. An archaeologist/heritage practitioner should conduct a walkthrough of the proposed development area after vegetation clearing before the start of any construction activities. An archaeologist must also monitor all levelling and trenching activities that forms part of the development.
- 3. An archaeologist must monitor all levelling and trenching activities that forms part of the development.
- 4. Should the remains of build structures that are older than 60 years or concentrations of historical material be uncovered after vegetation clearing or during the construction phase, a historian / heritage practitioner must be appointed to evaluate the find and to determine if a destruction permit needs to be obtained from the Eastern Cape Heritage Resources Authority (ECPHRA) in terms of Section 34 of the National Heritage Resources Act, No. 25 of 1999.
- 5. If any dense concentrations of historical dump material are exposed during the development, work must stop immediately and reported to the appointed historian (who will determine if a collecting strategy is required) or to the Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority (043 492 1370).

C. PIA recommendations page 26 (Nel, R. 2024)

While mitigation measures are not mandatory, it is strongly recommended to follow the ensuing guidelines to ensure the discovery, preservation, and proper management of palaeontological resources during the proposed excavation and construction activities:

- The Environmental Compliance Officer responsible for project oversight should possess a comprehensive understanding of the potential presence of fossils within the project area. They must be well-informed about the likelihood of uncovering fossils when excavating into the underlying strata.
- Construction managers and supervisory personnel involved in the project should also be informed about the potential discovery of significant fossils on-site.
- During the excavation process, it is critical to conduct thorough inspections of any geological exposures encountered to identify the presence of fossil remains.
- If any fossils of significance, including trace fossils or invertebrates, are discovered, the ECO should promptly notify the appropriate authorities for further investigation (Appendix 3: Chance Fossil Finds Procedure).

NOTE: ECPHRA is the responsible heritage authority within the Eastern Cape, not SAHRA, unless there are national resources within the impacted landscape being developed. Therefore, reports should be addressed to ECPHRA not SAHRA or Albany Museum.
